
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
Training of Multipurpose Health Workers



A 45 second time limit per question was set following which the participants were asked to read out their answers and all options were discussed. The incorrect answers were eliminated after which appropriate choice was discussed and explained. The participants were asked to express their feedback regarding the experience through the program and for knowing the extent to which they were benefited by the activities conducted during the course of the program.


## SEQUENCE OF EVENTS:

#### 1. Introduction:

Learning new concepts in dentistry can be a cumbersome process often leading to disinterest. With the intention of addressing this problem ,edutainment was considered. Scattergories is one such game conducted for the present interns and I MDS students from the Department of Public Health Dentistry where the participants quickly fill out a category list with answers that begin with the same letter. The category list was based on subjects in dentistry. Score points if no other player matches their answers. .

2. Sequence of events and plan:

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The game of scattergories consisted of 3rounds.

Before the start of the game, a list of 12 categories was made which was used during the rounds. Nagar, 1st Phasa. The game of scattergories consisted of 3rounds. R.V. DENTAL COLLEGE

Game began by picking a letter card from the fish bowl and a timer of 6 mins was started. Participants had to fill in the category list using appropriate words beginning from the letter picked.

Scoring/Winning:

Players took turns reading their lists. Crossed out any answers that matched another player's. Players scored one point for each answer not crossed out. Additional points for challenging and justifying.

Creative answers were allowed, but any player had the option of challenging an answer. If an answer was challenged, all players, including the player whose answer was being challenged, voted on the acceptability. Majority rules. Three such rounds were conducted and concluded. The scores were calculated at the end of the game and the highest scorer was announced the winner.





#### Discussion and conclusion:

The program was concluded with an informal feedback and review session.

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## 4. Report of the Programme

After discussing the objective and sequence of events of the program with staff and the H.O.D ,an approval from the H.O.D , Department of Public Health Dentistry was obtained to conduct the program .

The edutainment program was scheduled on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of September 2020 from 1:30 pm to 3:00 pm in the seminar hall and a total of 6 participants were invited.

As this program focused on the concept of learning through self introspection, not much time was spent in preparation.

The program was started with a brief introduction of the game.

Rules of the game and scoring criteria were explained.

Each participant was then given a sheet of paper and pen to make the list.

A fish bowl containing letter cards was kept.

Game began with making of category list in which participants had to fill in appropriate words starting with the letter card picked. Making of list with 12 dental categories took 10 minutes.

A total of 3 rounds were played . Each round took about 20-22mins.

A timer for 6 mins was kept . Participants had to make list of 12 words starting from the letter picked that precisely fit each

This was followed by reading out each other's list and brainstorming about it.

For each unique word a score of 1 was awarded and an additional 1 point for giving a valid statement about the same word . Individual scores were being tabulated by the moderator.

After 3 similar rounds, the scores were calculated and the participant with the highest score was announced the winner






The program was concluded with an informal feedback and review session .

Through this program each participant learnt the concept of time management, enhanced their ability to challenge and defend their answers . It also tested their subject knowledge.

#### 5. Conclusion

The programme ended with the participants' input and advice on how to refine the programme better. The participants were asked about their experience on the programme and how the programme helped them to furnish their knowledge about Dentistry. The participants also mentioned how edutainment could enhance their theoretical knowledge and introduction to such programmes is very important and should be carried out on a regular basis. Most participants agreed that "edutainment" was indeed a fun way of learning. Each participant equally participated and their scores ranged between 36 and 48 points







5. Conclusion:



Discussion on the topic for 15 minutes regarding the various challenges faced by the individuals in the clipping and to provide their own perspective on the stories seen.







#### Sequence of events:

We were expected to work together as a team with each team having two member; the group of interns were paired up and were allocated an area. We began with Jayanagar 8<sup>th</sup> block and covered the 5<sup>th</sup> block.

Each team was supposed to collect data for the Covid vaccination, which was to be conducted in the coming month. The method of data collection was - through a door-to-door survey. We were expected to visit each house and collect data from the family members, this was a digital survey where the information collected from the families was then fed in the app - new namma samudaya, and the work was laborious.

Brief report:

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We were asked to meet a target of 50 houses /day per team. However, the scorching heat made it a tough job, so we aimed towards 30 house/day and did achieve the target.

We meet various kinds of people some of whom were keen on knowing as to what the survey was about and had patiently answered all our questions. Some of the elderly were very cordial. While some of them remain troubled. Together we achieved our target and after a day of hectic work, it felt amazing with all the praises we received valuing our sincerity and selfless service.

But also the question like "the need for a door to door survey during a pandemic, especially in areas where people are digitally grown and hold expertise with the gizmos was really necessary?" Left us conflicted.

#### Feed back from participants:

To sum up, our overall experience during this posting was great and it gave us an insight on how surveys are conducted and in the perception a of public health dentist, it also threw light on the real world problems we are facing. It shed light on how anxious people were about the whole pandemic, and their need for vaccine amidst this crisis.



The Department of Conservative Dentistry and Endodontics conducted a visit to Technodent Lab, Bangalore on 19/12/2020. The visit was organized through the department in association with Mr. S Nagendran, Marketing Manager - Technical and Digital, Ivoclar Vivadent Marketing India Pvt Ltd., for the staff and post graduates. During the visit, a demonstration was given on the various aspects of contemporary digital dentistry which included CADCAM procedures and 3D printing. The digital scanning of a patient's cast, digital planning and fabrication of a crown template on the computer and the 3D milling of it from zirconia blanks was demonstrated. The working of the 3D printing machine was also explained in detail. In addition to this, the lab visit also included the conventional ceramic lab where the lab procedures for fabricating a PFM crown was shown.

The post graduates received a good exposure to the lab procedures involved in fabricating various dental prostheses, which the students usually would not be exposed to in a regular college set up. On the whole the visit was truly insightful and opened up various opportunities for the post graduate students to step up their level of patient care and make the most of digital dentistry today. 
