36. Does the department obtain feedback from Faculty on curriculum as well as teaching-learning-evaluation? If yes, how does the department utilize the feedback?

• Yes Periodic staff meetings to discuss the implementation of parent university syllabus and teaching beyond syllabus is held. The Head of the department chairs the meeting and moderates the feedback from the faculty and student members of the department.

- The feedback is used as a guideline for formulating and updating UG and PG programs to contemporary level.
- All activities of the students are evaluated by the faculty using appropriate forms.

Students on staff, curriculum and teaching-learning-evaluation and how does the department utilize the feedback?

- Students are encouraged to give their feedback on the teaching methodology followed in the department. These feedback opinions are assessed by the faculty in consultation with the head of the department and students themselves.
- These feedbacks have led to the incorporation of newer teaching learning methodologies mentioned above that have been incorporated.
- Student answer scripts are discussed and their performance in clinical assessment examination on one to one basis with their respective mentors. These discussions help the faculty understands the fears and misconceptions of the students and takes appropriate corrective steps from time to time.
- Also a few research studies have focused on obtaining student feedback on the dental public health curriculum using Focus group methods.
